B.3: Authority of the Bible

[2 Timothy 3:16,17, Matthew 4:4]

A STORY

The church leader along with others agreed “The apostle Paul got that wrong.” That statement alone betrayed their attitude. They did not believe in the authority of the Bible. If that is wrong, what else is wrong?

More than ever in this generation many people are questioning the authority of the Bible. How do we go about building a conviction about the authority of the Bible? If someone needs external evidence to the credibility of the documents of the Bible, looking at Josh McDowell’s book, *Evidence that Demands a Verdict*. However, if you are coaching the Bible there are several verses that are helpful.

DIGGING INTO THE BIBLE

2 Timothy 3:16,17:

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness. That the man of God might be equipped and thoroughly furnished for every good work.

DIGGING INTO THE BIBLE A LITTLE MORE

2 Peter 1:16-21:

¹⁶ For we did not follow cleverly devised stories when we told you about the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ in power, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. ¹⁷ He received honor and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased." ¹⁸ We ourselves heard this voice that came from heaven when we were with him on the sacred mountain. ¹⁹ We also have the prophetic message as something completely reliable, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. ²⁰ Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation of things. ²¹ For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.
